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STURN TO SEEK OUTAGAMIE EXECUTIVE POSITION

Change needed, significant endorsements

GREENVILLE, WI – Kevin Sturn, a resident of Greenville, recently filed an application to be placed on the 2023 spring ballot for the office of Outagamie County Executive. Tom Nelson, the current Outagamie County Executive, was elected to the seat in 2011.

“The office requires a genuine commitment and focused dedication,” Sturn said. “A strong relationship with the Outagamie County Board of Supervisors is essential, and my experience as a supervisor will prove invaluable. It’s important to remember that the office of County Executive is a non-partisan management position.”

Sturn served on the Outagamie County board from 2012 to 2020, including two terms as Finance Committee Chair. Sturn believes public safety should be the number-one priority for Outagamie County.

“I intend to improve public safety by cooperating and collaborating with the Sheriff’s department and the Health and Human Services department to protect children, seniors and those in need of mental health services.”

Sturn also emphasized the need to manage the county’s sizable human resources to retain employees and recruit the best candidates in an increasingly competitive economy.

“We have important operations to staff” he explained. “Outagamie County runs a large business operation. The county provides services in areas as diverse as airport, highway maintenance, recycling, the courts, veterans services and Brewster Village just to name a few. Quality personnel are at a premium. We must find ways to attract and keep the best people. We owe that to the taxpayers.”
